

This is a casual, moderatepaced drive. The road conditions can often be iffy at this time of year, so the pace of the drive will take into consideration recent and current weather.

#### Start:

Meet at 9:00AM at Starbucks in Los Gatos (624 Blossom Hill Rd.), which is next to Los Gatos Luxury Cars.

- Exit Right at Bear Creek Rd
- Left at STOP onto Bear Creek
- Continue past Hwy 35
- Right onto Hwy 9 (STOP sign)
- Right at STOP sign to stay on Hwy 9 toward Saratoga
- Left onto Hwy 35 Skyline (STOP sign)

We will have a photo-op stop just past Page Mill Rd.

- Continue on Hwy 35
- Right onto Hwy 92 toward San Mateo (STOP sign)
- Continue Straight at Signal
- Right onto Canada Rd (before the freeway starts)
- Left onto Edgewood Rd
- Right onto Alameda de las Pulgas (signal)
- Left at signal onto Whipple
- Continue on Whipple to Hwy 101 South
- Take ramp onto Hwy 101 South
- Exit Hwy 101 onto Marsh Rd EAST. Left at signal over the overpass
- Right onto Bayfront Expwy (signal)
- Right onto Chrysler (1<sup>st</sup> signal)
- Left onto Constitution (signal)
- Continue to Auto Vino on left. (205 Constitution, Menlo Park) Take driveway to right of building to the rear and park.

# A Memorable Decade of GGLC and Lotus Events in the 2010s

The 2010s are now a decade of memories, some good, and some not-so-good. But, with the perspective of being able to look back at the past 10 years of Lotus happenings and GGLC events, I feel there were some things that are especially worth noting and remembering.

Here, then, is my list (in no particular order) of 11 of the Most Memorable Lotus and GGLC Events of the 2010s.

What events and memories are at the top of your list?

# BAHAR PARIS and LA INTRODUCIONS OF 5 NEW LOTUS MODELS—2010

There we were, standing outside the stations at the 2010 LA Auto Show on Press Day. There were 5 draped shapes on the Lotus stand, and Dany Bahar was about to make his entrance.

He opened the Press Conference with lots of words about Lotus and the future, and then with each celebrity introduction (the Baldwin brothers and Sharon Stone) came 5 new Lotus cars. Some in the press doubted, some shook their heads and some rolled their eyes. Unfortunately, there were only a few believers of the fantasy story that they just witnessed.

# FORMATION OF GGLC-SACRAMENTO (2014), LOTUS CLUB OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA (2016) and SAN DIEGO LOTUS CLUB (2018)

Three GGLC sister clubs were started in the 2010s. The Sacramento group formed in 2014 with a simple idea of having a group to do Lotus "stuff"

together, such as dinners, drives and even Lotus camping trips.

Two years later, the GGLC helped a group of Lotus enthusiasts form Lotus Club of Southern California with the same simple idea of doing Lotus "stuff" together, breakfast meetings, drives, Lotus camping trips and even a HPDE at the Streets of Willow Springs in Rosamond. And, more recently, a group of Lotus enthusiasts in

San Diego formed the San Diego Lotus Club.

#### WCLM 2013 SEATTLE

The 2013 West Coast Lotus Meet (WCLM) was the first one held in the Seattle area, and the Evergreen Lotus Car Club (ELCC) rolled out the welcome mat that made for one of the most memorable WCLMs.

Notable events included stops at the Flying Heritage Museum, the Vintage Races and Griot's Garage. Highlighted by the WCLM Concours and

# INTRODUCTION OF THE LOTUS EVIJA AT QUAIL—2019

In sharp contrast to the fiasco Bahar fantasy introduction of new models 9 years earlier, Lotus emerged from the Geely purchase 3 years ago by showing the world what Lotus could do with some real resources, and they gave us the Evija!

The GGLC was invited to the North American launch during Monterey Week where we could see, feel and gawk at the prototype. The Evija is just stunning, and very special, as only 130 are to be produced with an unobtainable price tag for most.

#### GGLC/UK LOTUS TOUR— 2016

The GGLC/UK Lotus tour was another highlight in a decade of highlights.

Five days were spent touring the places where Lotus made automotive history, including stops at the original factory in Hornsey, and then Cheshunt.

Visits with Malcom Rickett and Ketteringham Hall, once home to Team Lotus F1. A day at the factory, rides on the Lotus test track and a visit with Clive Chapman owner of Classic Team Lotus.

The grand tour was topped with a dinner with many of the men who made Lotus, Morris Dowton, Tony Shute, the late Roger Becker, Patrick Peal, Nick Adams and Mike Kimberley. Every day was expertly led

by Richard Parramint and his "side kick", Bob Dance!


#### GGLC AUTOCROSS WED-DING—2019

This may have been the first and only Autocross Wedding, and it happened with the GGLC!

What started as a simple ask from GGLC member and avid autocrosser, Lulu: "could she and Gerry invite a few friends to a GGLC autocross to witness their exchange of vows?" quickly turned into an EVENT!

So, there we were a year later in the middle of an autocross course under a white tent, Lulu drives up in her Elise, hops out to an awaiting Gerry. A few vows, an exchange of rings, a kiss and the newlyweds drive off in the Elise with some wheel spin and onto the course! Congratulations to Lulu and Gerry!





#### GGLC, DAVE & ROBERTA BEAN & WILD FIRES—2015 & 2017

When the NorCal Butte Fire of 2015 erupted, it sent a chill through many GGLCers and Lotus Enthusiasts. The fire spread rapidly, and we knew that many of our Lotus friends were potentially in its path.

We soon learned that the home of Dave and Roberta Bean (Dave Bean Engineering) was destroyed.

The rally cry went out, and the response from the Lotus community was inspired. Words of encouragement and offers of help poured in and a crew of Lotus folks spent a day with Dave sorting through the ashes and cleaning a few things up. Sadly, just two years later another alert hit our community with news of Dave's passing. And, again our community poured out their hearts to Roberta and the DBE crew.

#### GGLC THEMED AUTOCROSS EVENTS - Halloween, Cinco de Mayo, Apple iPhone & more

Whoever coined "Think Outside the Box" had the GGLC autocrosses in mind!

While many other autocross clubs have established traditional formats, the GGLC has taken a few risks to try new things, some in the interest of increased safety, and some just for fun.

For safety, the GGLC was the first to have course workers wear neon safety vests. Now, nearly every club uses them. For fun, expect to see us run the course in the opposite directions in the afternoon sessions or do enduro-style runs. We have also introduced our ever-popular themed events that feature unique course designs. Examples are the Jack-O-Lantern-shaped Halloween course, or the Apple 5 course for the iPhone 5 intro, the linked wedding rings at the Wedding event or the very popular Sombrero course on May 5<sup>th</sup> (Cinco de Mayo).

#### **GGLC TRACK DAYS – Maximize Seat Time**

The big news about GGLC Track Days is not any particular event or day, but the consistency of maximized seat time, easy and casual sessions, accessibility and just plain FUN! John and Scott have chaired the GGLC Track Days for quite a few years, but they have more recently gotten help from Rita and Carlos and Mona. And, with that renewed energy the events were taken to a new level.

#### GGLC - WCLM SOUTH TAHOE (2014), SOL-VANG (2017) and FOLSOM (2019)

Each of the West Coast Lotus Meets are unique as they celebrate everything Lotus, but there were three


