## GGLC to Offer Custom Lotus/UK Tour in 2023

It has been 7 years since the GGLC organized a specially designed Lotus/UK Tour. So putting another one together for 2023 seems like a good idea.

We are still in the process of developing a full itinerary for the tour as well as working out what the costs will be, but the basic outline of what is planned is given below.

#### When\*:

September 3-11, 2023

#### Who:

The GGLC Lotus Tour will be led and hosted by Richard Parramint. Richard's involvement with Lotus began in the late 60s when he worked at the factory as a teen, and it continues today through his relationship with Classic Team Lotus.

### What:

This is a group tour that begins at London-Heathrow.

<u>Day 1</u>, tour participants will be collected from London

Heathrow and driven to hotel.

<u>Day 2</u>, the group will visit

Hornsey/Cheshunt factory and head to Norfolk.

<u>Day 3</u>, group visits:

- Lotus factory;
- Classic Team Lotus;
- Ketteringham Hall, East Carlton Manor;
- Colin and Hazel's final resting place.

<u>Day 4.</u> possible Lotus track day and/or Lotus Driver Academy on the Hethel Track (optional). <u>Day 5.</u> head to the Goodwood Revival (optional)

This is a rough itinerary at this point, and it is subject to change. Most likely there will be other "special" things to see and do and, of course, special people to meet.

#### Cost:

Cost is still TBD (for reference, our trip in 2016 was \$5600 per couple). The cost will include tour transportation (while in England). Hotel costs will also be included, but meals will not be.

You can expect that pricing will be broken out for the base tour, and that the Lotus Driver Academy and Goodwood visit will each be priced separately.

Transportation to and from the UK is not included. You may want to take a few extra days on either or both ends of the tour to visit other places in the UK or Europe that might be of interest.

In order to maximize the experience, we will try to keep the group size to about 12-15 (19 is capacity). All Lotus enthusiasts are invited; however GGLC members and their guests will be given first consideration should we reach capacity.

So, what do you think? We expect this will be a once-in-a-lifetime experience. Excited?
