


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Lotus Makes a Splash at Monterey Car Week 2023

Thursday, 08/17/23—The Day Before Quail— Time at Laguna and The Evija Deliveries

Lotus "owned" Quail Lodge both Wednesday and Thursday, August 16-17. At various times, the hotel portico was filled with 8-10 Emiras, 5-6 Electres and a blue Evija. Quite a sight!!!

Add to that, there were 3-4 more Emiras in the parking lot and 3 Fittipaldi Evijas hidden away, not to mention Jenson Button's personal Evija getting a place on the Lotus stand for The Quail, A Motorsports Gathering show on Friday.

Emira demo drives were featured, and they were met enthusiastically. From what I saw, nearly all the available slots were taken. The format was conducive to letting the driver really get a feel for the car. Drivers were able to drive solo in a lead/follow format in groups of 4-5 cars led by a Lotus rep. The pace was brisk on nearby canyon roads.




Thursday was the first time to see the Eletre in the flesh. IMPRESSED! No doubt, it is a full-size SUV—a bit larger than a Ford Explorer—but the shape, side, and rear exterior are fresh looks. Unfortunately, the cars were locked, so I was not able to get a good look at the interior.

After lunch in the Lotus hospitality area, I headed to Laguna. Arriving at the track the first thing I noticed was how dark (and black) the new pavement appeared. The berms were freshly painted, and I could see wider run-off areas around some of the corners. I can't wait to feel the grippiness of the new tarmac at the GGLC's Track Day in late October!

After parking near Turn 8 (the fabled Corkscrew), I followed the track side path past turns 9 and 10 to the paddock. As is typical at the Reunion, the paddock was overflowing with amazing cars.

I started by seeking out fellow GGLCer, Chris Locke. Chris was running in the Historic F1 group with his ex-Andretti Lotus 77. It was not difficult to find him as he was near the end of the row filled with F1 and F5000 cars.

After a few minutes with Chris, I headed across the paddock, and along the way I passed a tent with a display of significant historic racing Corvettes. What an amazing and impressive display of Corvette race cars and prototypes!

After a brief stop to see the ex-de Angelis Lotus 91 brought to the Reunion by Classic Team Lotus, I went to find a good vantage point to watch qualifying for the Historic F1 group.

Chris went out on sticker tires. Between the new pave-

ment and fresh tires, he was one of the quickest non-ground effects cars. Indeed, he was some 2 seconds quicker than his best previous time!

Tucked away in the Camel Valley was a private Lotus evening, where 3 Fittipaldi versions of the Evija were shown with Emerson's Type 72 championship Lotus. Amongst the guests were 3 Evija customers who took delivery of their cars that evening!

Friday, 08/18/23—The Quail, A Motorsports Gathering

Rahul Nair joined me Friday morning. We were fortunate to have passes for the Quail courtesy of Lotus, and Rahul had a parking pass that got us into Lot C (across from the Lodge).

Parking at the Quail is a bit surreal, as the car park was

inundated with Ferraris, Bentleys, Astons, Lambos and highend Bimmers, Porsches and Audis. If you had driven your Ford Focus, you would be the one with a rare car!

After parking, we made our way to the show entry. We showed and had our wrist bands scanned, and then immediately found ourselves at the Gordon Murray stand for the start of the press conference.

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The Lotus stand was in the center of the show. Three significant cars were on display: the Eletre and Jenson Button's Evija were on one side; while on the opposite side was a covered vehicle behind a sign reading "Type 66".

The Lotus press conference started punctually at 11:15am. The highly anticipated proceedings began with Simon Lane, Director of Lotus Advanced Performance, introducing the Type 66. The 66 was then firedup to allow the crowd to hear the glorious percussive noise of a V8!

Lane briefly shared that the Type 66 was designed by Lotus in 1969 with the intent to race in the CanAm series in the 1970s. Clive Chapman was then introduced to relate how the Type 66 came to reality. Clive told the assembled crowd that about 10 years ago he found the design drawings of the 66, and he showed those drawings to Russell Carr, head of Lotus Design. Carr had the physical drawings converted to CAD and 3D models and CG renderings, and he had models produced.

To help celebrate the 75th anniversary of Lotus, the Type 66 was built as a track-only vehicle. Exclusivity will be assured as only 10 cars will be built for customers.

Weighing in at less than 900kg with carbon fiber body work, the 66 features a 830HP, 550 lb


-ft, of torque push rod V8 in addition to a 6-speed sequential gearbox and race suspension. This very special car also features inboard spring/dampers,



carbon-ceramic brakes, modern race ABS and traction control.

Joining Simon and Clive on the stand, was Emerson Fittipaldi who expressed his desire to drive the 66 at Laguna. Emmo was also joined by another F1

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World Champion, Jenson Button. Quite amazing to have TWO F1 World Champions together on the Lotus stand. It was truly a bit of a pinch-me moment!

Jenson shared his thoughts about how the 66 harkened to the time when drivers "drove" and racing was real. He added his desire to drive and possibly own the Type 66 before raving about his Evija in Brawn white, green and black livery to commemorate his championship. The conference wrapped up with group photo of team principals along with Clive, Jenson and Emmo.

Later in the day, there was a "fireside chat" with Emmo and the Lotus 72 he drove to his first championship.

Eletre

No doubt, the Eletre is controversial for Lotus enthusiasts. It seems there are two camps: those who hate it and feel as if Lotus is abandoning them and the "Lotus Ethos"; and those who are open to change and en-



dorse, or accept, that Lotus needs to expand in order to survive, flourish and continue to build great sports cars (much in the same way that Porsche needed the Cayenne).

The Eletre featured on the Lotus stand was the extra spicy Eletre R in top spec, 905HP form. It was incredibly well received, and it attracted a constant crowd.

The Eletre, taken as an EV SUV is simply BRILLIANT. It hits all the right EV buttons: fast charging high voltage platform, excellent range, and strong battery management. As a luxury vehicle, it is innovative, roomy for both front and rear passengers, comfortable and it has an airy, inviting cabin.

Some Emira News for North America

Of course, the big question is "When are we going to see Emiras?" Reading the Lotus and Emira Forums online is fraught with peril, lots of ugly words, lots of rumors, and lots of anger and accusations. But there seems to be some confidence that production of North American cars would start in the next few weeks, and that deliveries could be seen before the end of year.

Take this at face value, and it means there are not a huge stash of Emiras laying waste at some port of entry waiting for certifications and/or missing parts (one of the more laughable rumors floating about on social media). But it does mean that most of the parts logistics problems have been solved and many of the early production issues and faults have been identified and resolved in other markets.

Lotus Etna

An unusual surprise at The Quail was seeing a Lotus Etna in the Italian Designer collection.

You may recognize the Etna name as a volcano on Sicily, but not a Lotus. The Lotus Etna was shown at the 1984 British International Motor Show as a oneoff concept car from Giorgetto Giugiaro. It was powered by a 909 4.0L Lotus V8 (essentially two 2.0L Lotus 907 engines).

So, to see it nearly 40 years later sitting on the grass at the Quail caught me completely offguard.

Sunday, 08/20—The 2nd Annual Corkscrew Hillclimb & Pebble Beach

Sunday at Pebble, the Type 66 was featured on the Concept

Lawn. It looked stunning amongst other "out-there" concept cars.

Meanwhile, back at Laguna, the 2nd Corkscrew Hillclimb was held. To refresh your memory, the Corkscrew Hillclimb has cars making a standing start at the normal start/finish line, except they're pointed towards Turn 11!

The Hillclimb takes drivers around Turn 11, then Turn 10 and 9. The culmination is going up the steep incline of the legendary Corkscrew opposite to the normal direction of travel with the finish at Turn 7! Repeating last year's win in this unique event was Chris Locke in his Lotus 77! Congratulations Chris!!!

Conclusion


It was quite a week for Lotus. In the span of a few days, you were reminded of the Lotus heritage, saw Lotus of today, and got a peek at Lotus' future.

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Lotus Achieves Record First Half 2023 Sales

Abstracted from Lotus Press Release

Key achievements at Lotus for the first six months ending June 30, 2023, included:

- order book grew to approximately 17,000 vehicles worldwide for the Eletre, Lotus' first electric lifestyle hyper-SUV, and for the Emira,
- produced over 2,200 Emiras in its UK sportscar manufacturing facility, which is a 381 percent increase from FY22,
- filled the order book for Emira for the next two years,
- ramped up production of Lotus' lifestyle hyper-SUV, Eletre, this year in its first all-electric vehicle factory (customer deliveries began in China at the end of March, and Lotus expects to deliver to UK and European customers later this summer),
- expanded its global retail network to 193 stores, opening 24 new outlets over the first half of 2023,
- expanded into South Korea, one of the largest luxury markets in the world, through a partnership to sell Lotus vehicles with the leading regional automotive retailer, Kolon Mobility Group, and
- won nine awards won globally including 'SUV of the Year' for Eletre at GQ Car Awards and 'Best Performance Car' for Emira at UK Car of the Year Awards.

Additionally, Mike Johnstone joined the business as Chief Commercial Officer, bringing over 25 years of international experience in leading and growing automotive brands. He will be responsible for global business and product strategy, as well as international expansion.

Feng Qingfeng, CEO of Lotus Group said: "We set an ambitious goal in 2018, with the launch of our Vision80 strategy to transform the business from a traditional automotive brand to become an all-electric, luxury, mobility provider in ten years. We have spent the last few years laying the foundations for success and today's announcement demonstrates that Lotus is no longer the same business that it was in previous years. We are firmly on track to becoming a global performance brand by 2028."

Lotus plans to further ramp up production and sales for the second half of the year and expects the full year to surpass all previous years.
