



## Carter Alexander



Last year, on the afternoon of March 20th, Carter F. Alexander wheeled his green Jaguar sedan around Infineon Raceway, setting the pace for the Annual Opening Race of CSRG (Classic Sports Racing Group) . It was part of his new life. Eighteen months earlier he traded his Lotus Super 7 and the vintage racing he had enjoyed since 1978 for a new focus: he would write motoring columns, lead the driver mentoring program at CSRG, continue as president of his company EMS, and do whatever else he wanted. For the first time his "Big Cat" was the pace car and he loved it.

At home, hours later, he suffered a seizure. The man who climbed to the 10,064 ft. peak of Mt. Baldy in celebration of his 62nd birthday six months before, was suddenly entering a new life he never expected. An operation a month later confirmed a brain tumor.

Carter, as always, rose to the occasion and told us he had no regrets. He lived his life fully and accomplished more than he ever dreamed. He was thankful he lived in beautiful Sonoma, in a house perfectly designed for his upcoming trials, he was thankful for his wife Roberta, made of "Swedish steel" he said and beside him through every moment of their 37 year marriage. He was thankful for his daughter Christina, her husband Kenny and their 4-year-old twin girls, Morgan and Anden. His voice wavered only when he thought about not watching the

twins grow up.

Carter was determined to battle the tumor into remission. He endured arduous chemo and radiation through clinical trials at UCSF and, when there was no success from that quarter, he pursued chemo therapies through December. fie would never give up the fight or his dreams of leading the field once again. He was a strong, determined man with the most astonishing grace. Together with his wife Roberta, they founded his company, EMS (European Marketing and Sales), which celebrates its 25th anniversary in June.

Through EMS he worked in the world of technology, bringing US firms to Europe where he and Roberta lived in the early 1970's.

Carter's life was family, friends, business, politics, road cars, motor racing. In 1976 they joined friends at eleven Formula One Grand Prixs in Europe. In 1978 they bought their present house in Sonoma where they have lived and entertained hundreds of friends these past 28 years. Always the most gracious hosts, Carter and

Roberta's attention to others didn't flag throughout these last months. As we filed through their home to share a movie video, a pizza, or a motor race, their warmth and interest in their friends rose above the sad physical circumstances. No matter how tired or weak he was, Carter always asked us how we were, how our children were doing, what was happening in our lives. He remembered details about every conversation and always focused on others.

Carter passed away in the early hours of Good Friday the 14th of April. His family, Roberta, Christina, Kenny, Andan and Morgan, and Jeanne Bohlen will miss him terribly as will all of his friends around the world.

In addition to the tireless devotion of Roberta, Hospice made the unbearable bearable. To them a great debt of gratitude is due. In lieu of flowers, a donation in Carter's name to Marin Hospice 190 West Napa Street Sonoma CA 95476 is appreciated. Memorial services will be private.

Registration for OpenRoads 2006 at Lake Tahoe-an all-British weekend sponsored by the Golden Gate Austin Healey Club—is now open and registration numbers are now being issued.

The OpenRoads 2006 weekend meet will be held June 9 to 11, 2006, at the Horizon Casino and Resort in Stateline NV on Lake Tahoe's South Shore. The meet will start on Friday, June 9 with a reception and welcoming party at the Horizon. On Saturday there is a day of autocrossing and touring planned with a banquet Saturday night. On Sunday, there will be a car show and departure.


"The roads around Tahoe this time of year are at their most scenic and traffic is at a minimum," said Event Chairman Dave Nock, "It's a beautiful place to bring a British car."

Price for the weekend is \$45 per registration and includes two adults and one car. Additional cars and adults attendees are \$20 each. There no registration charge for children under 15. Supplemental charges include a \$30 charge per car for the autocross. And a \$48 charge per person for the awards dinner (\$30 for those under 15). Golden Gate has arranged for 200 rooms at the Horizon at \$95 per night (single or double); \$105 triple occupancy; \$115 (four). Taxes are not


